ClimaTech Conference to Headline Boston's First Ever Climate Week

In partnership with Climatebase, annual event will bring together leaders in innovation, policymaking, finance, and business to drive climate action at scale

BOSTON, MA (March 9, 2026) – ClimaTech with Climatebase and the Climate Week Network, today announced that ClimaTech 2026 will take place during Boston's first-ever Climate Week, with the flagship conference taking place on May 4 and 5. The annual event, hosted in a city known as a global innovation hub uniquely positioned in the climate space, will bring together policymakers, entrepreneurs, investors, and corporate leaders in Boston to focus on innovation and bringing new technologies to market to combat the climate crisis and spur economic growth.

As the flagship event of Boston Climate Week and co-presented by Climatebase and the Climate Week Network, ClimaTech 2026 will take place at Boston Center for the Arts Campus in the city's historic South End neighborhood. The annual conference will feature keynote addresses, panel discussions, workshops, a Climate Tech Frontier expo, TED-style talks, and meaningful networking opportunities. Conference events will connect change-makers, celebrate progress, and inspire action, helping attendees rethink how tech-fueled innovation can help us meet our goals.

Meanwhile, Boston Climate Week will bring together the region's growing climate ecosystem from May 3 to 10 for a week of citywide programming and collaboration. Organized in partnership by ClimaTech, Climatebase, and the Climate Week Network, the inaugural event is expected to feature more than 100 events, with more than 5,000 attendees, and participation from hundreds of organizations across the climate technology, policy, finance, and innovation communities. Throughout the week, entrepreneurs, investors, policymakers, researchers, and community leaders will gather across Boston to showcase solutions, forge partnerships, and accelerate climate progress.

Throughout the conference, ClimaTech 2026 will focus on three key content tracks:

- **Scaling innovation and financing growth:** How technologies can get from lab to market, with supportive funding at speed
- **Enabling systems, resilience & market transformation:** What systems, markets, and policies need to change to unlock climate tech at scale
- **Climate technology as a business opportunity:** Creating and unlocking business opportunities across industries

“We intentionally designed ClimaTech to break down silos within the climate and technology industries and catalyze innovation, investment, and scale,” said **Maya Peleg, Brand Director, ClimaTech at Emerald**. “By partnering with Climatebase and the Climate Week Network to host Boston’s first-ever Climate Week, we are convening leaders and changemakers across the spectrum to drive impactful growth and investment in the future.”
